Executive Summary

Friends of DHA is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to providing vital funding for services directly benefiting residents within and beyond DHA's affordable housing communities. Our overarching aim is to empower residents in the areas of Youth Development, Economic Self-Sufficiency, Healthy Living, Digital Inclusion, and Community Building.



Vision

To support self-sufficiency programming for residents with two main goals:

- Empower individuals to break free from the cycle of poverty and achieve lasting economic independence.
- Help our senior citizens and individuals with disabilities to thrive comfortably within their homes, maintaining their cherished independence without the need for assisted living.

Friends of DHA is governed by a 15-member Board and a management agreement with the Denver Housing Authority.

We collaborate with key partners to offer supportive programs that enhance education, foster leadership skills, and lay the foundation for selfsufficiency, addressing the higher risks youth face.




Economic Self-Sufficiency

Digital Inclusion

DHA partners with nonprofits and internet companies to offer affordable internet, tech devices, and free digital classes to residents. The goal is to equip DHA residents with the digital access and tools for success in education. healthcare, and employment.



Community Building

Community engagement is vital to RCC programming. Establishing trust through resident case management and community events is essential, enabling residents to progress in finances, education, digital literacy, and health.















The Communities We Serve


The Denver Housing Authority

The Denver Housing Authority is a quasi-municipal corporation with a portfolio of over 13,000 units and housing choice vouchers, providing affordable housing to more than 30,000 very low, low and middle-income individuals representing over 13,000 families. DHA has transformed public housing in Denver creating vibrant, revitalized, sustainable, transit oriented, and mixed-income communities of choice.





Programming - Youth



Year-End Support for Youth

For the fifth year in a row, Friends of DHA's holiday fundraiser was featured on Channel 7's Next with Kyle Clark Word of Thanks as December's highlighted charity. This annual effort provides gift cards to children in public housing, ensuring every family can share something special during the holidays. In 2024, Friends of DHA distributed gift cards to **1,840** DHA youth.

Summer Reading Book Club

This past summer, Friends of DHA hosted the Children's Summer Reading Club, bringing joy, literacy, and learning to DHA youth ages 2 to 13. Throughout the weeklong clubs, children participated in daily reading sessions, interactive games, and lively songs, all while enjoying healthy lunches and exciting book giveaways.

The highlight of the program was the final celebration day, where participants received new book bags and filled them with a selection of new and gently used donated books to take home and cherish. This initiative fostered a love for reading and helped build personal libraries for DHA youth, ensuring they had access to books beyond the summer months.

Programming - Economic Self-Sufficiency



EMAP Program

Friends of DHA partnered with the State of Colorado Department of Local Affairs to disburse Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program (EMAP) funds to homeowners in Colorado late on their mortgage, HOA, and/or utility fees. This program paid their overdue balance as well as the next three months of their bills to help them reset and maintain their home. In 2024, Friends of DHA supported **55** homeowners by paying out over **\$855,000**. Friends of DHA earned **\$55,000** in fee for service revenue to support the administration of the program.

Financial Coaching and Homeownership

The Financial Coach program offers one-on-one support and workshops to help DHA participants strengthen their financial well-being. In 2024, the program held 107 sessions with 68 clients, helped open 21 bank accounts, and hosted 31 workshops with 422 visits. Additionally, our coach helped launch the Concrete Roses Society, providing financial, career, and wellness support for youth in DHA programs.

Friends of DHA supports first-time homebuyers through education and counseling. We contract with **CHFA** and **eHome** to provide homebuyer education, reaching **1,239** households in 2024 and generating **\$88,049** in service revenue. Additionally, we fund two HUD-Certified Housing Counselors who offer one-on-one support, helping clients prepare for homeownership or navigate foreclosure.

Programming - Healthy Living, Digital Inclusion



Expressions Program

In 2024, the Expressions Program, funded through Caring for Denver, supported low-income seniors in public housing through art, music, and expressive therapies, breaking down barriers to mental health care. The program provided group therapy, wellness checks, and individual sessions in partnership with licensed providers, addressing mental health challenges linked to poverty and social isolation.

Digital Navigator Partnerships

In 2024, DHA strengthened its commitment to bridging the digital divide through strategic partnerships with the City of Denver and the State of Colorado's Digital Navigator programs. These collaborations provided one-on-one tech assistance to residents, empowering them with essential digital skills and resources.

Throughout the year, Digital Navigators provided over **\$22,189** in in-kind services, which amounted to over **440** resident visits.

Expanding Access and Impact

In partnership with the **Colorado Department of Labor and Employment**, DHA expanded digital inclusion efforts for refugees and immigrants. Navigators offered one-on-one support at Quigg, Syracuse, and Mt. View, delivering 12 hours of weekly services from May to November, totaling **\$7,389** in in-kind support.

DHA and **Denver Public Library** continued their partnership, bringing Digital Navigators to Mulroy and North Lincoln. Two Navigators provided 7 hours of weekly support at each site, totaling **\$14,799** in in-kind services.

Programming - Community Building



Senior Ball

Each year, Friends of DHA hosts the Senior Ball, bringing older adults in public housing together to reduce social isolation and foster community. Last October, over 125 DHA seniors enjoyed a Motown-themed night with transportation, a three-course dinner, music, dancing, and memories in a '60s-inspired ballroom.

Cultural Integration Event

The Cultural Integration Event celebrated Mariposa's diverse community while connecting residents with clients from Lutheran Family Services (LFS). Four chefs—two from Mariposa and two referred by LFS—shared favorite dishes from their home countries. Attendees enjoyed the cuisine alongside a live African drum performance. Various partners provided resources on immigration, food access, and culturally responsive services. With over 130 attendees, including residents, DHA and LFS staff, and community partners, the event was a resounding success.

Economic Empowerment Summit

Friends of DHA brought together participants, partners, and staff to highlight economic self-sufficiency resources available through DHA and beyond. The two-part event featured virtual classes on financial basics, the cliff effect, entrepreneurship, and the housing market. Over 20 partners then joined a resource fair where attendees connected with organizations, enrolled in programs, shopped at our free boutique, and received professional headshots.

Community Gardens and Denver Botanic Gardens Partnership

Friends of DHA supported two garden apprentices this year with the Denver Botanic Gardens (DBG). Through this partnership, DBG was able to grow over **6,000** lbs of fresh produce in the Sun Valley and Mariposa Neighborhoods. Produce was distributed at weekly "pay what you can" farmers markets outside of the Osage Café & Mercado and Decatur Fresh.

Strategic Goals, Impact, and Future Projects

Friends of DHA's Strategic Plan


Friends of DHA bridges funding gaps in order to fulfill RCC programmatic efforts.

The <u>strategic plan</u> of Friends of DHA was formulated using insights gathered from RCC resident engagement endeavors, with the explicit aim of supporting each of the core focuses.

Impact

In 2024, Friends of DHA secured a diverse spread of funding, including over \$85,000 from our annual Wall of Fame celebration and almost \$80,000 in grants for mental health and wellness. In combination with supplemental fee for service income and new interest-earning short-term investment of reserves, Friends of DHA is able to continue to hit the goals of the strategic plan.





Future Projects


